Costa Brava

The 200 km of coastline that stretch from Portbou to Blanes are 200 km of unforgettable sensations.

Nature plays a crucial role, gifting the region with spectacular spots like Cap de Creus, Aiguamolls de l'Empordà, and the Medes Islands.

Undoubtedly, the most iconic scenery on the Costa Brava is its beaches, its crystal-clear water and golden sand, coves tucked away among the steep cliffs and quaint fishing villages.

But many other surprises and one-of-a-kind attractions are also waiting to be discovered, like the Bay of Roses, Banyoles Lake, and the botanical gardens that dot the coast.

The Costa Brava is landscape, culture and cuisine. Home to the Greco-Roman ruins of Empúries, medieval villages, the legacy of Girona's Jewish Quarter, the pottery tradition of La Bisbal d'Empordà, and the impact of local artists like surrealist Salvador Dalí, as well as cuisine and local products from the sea and land like anchovies, oil, and wine, the Costa Brava is a veritable amalgam of experiences as diverse as they are exciting.

Girona Pyrenees

The Girona Pyrenees is home to peaks that rise nearly three thousand meters above sea level, peaceful valleys dotted with mountain villages, ancient volcanoes covered with lush vegetation, and an immense beech wood that turns surprising colours with the seasons.

There are large monasteries and small rural churches that safeguard the region's spirit of Romanesque art, and villages that still preserve jewels of medieval architecture. Modernisme and contemporary art also abound with pictorial and architectural works by world-famous artists.



Location

Located in the northeast of the Iberian Peninsula, the province of Girona enjoys a strategic geographic location and a full range of infrastructures to help visitors easily reach the region and comfortably get around once here.

For overland travel, there is the high-speed train, with stations in Girona and Figueres, which connects with cities in Spain and France. By road, visitors can take the AP7 motorway that crosses the province from north to south and links up with the C-25 Eix Transversal (Transversal Arterial Road) that crosses Catalonia from east to west.

A wide range of cruise options are available to sea-goers, in addition to numerous marinas and vacht clubs.

The Girona-Costa Brava airport regularly receives charter planes and the Barcelona airport is just an hour away.
